


Her Na-rra-tion, Women's Narratives of the Canadian Nation

This volume assembles a series of conferences focusing on Canada as a textual nation, jointly organized by the Centres for Research in Canadian Studies at the University of Nantes and the University of Strasbourg. Through the examination of texts written by Canadian women or women living in Canada, it brings forward recent research on the writing, conception or making of the Canadian nation, as well as on national identity writing. The concept of "nation" is understood in a large perspective as contributions from Canadian and European scholars centre on the writing of the various "nations" and nationalities that compose the so-called Canadian mosaic. The concepts of "national" or "nationalism" in this plural interpretation inform critical analyses of textual productions coming from the various "national" communities integrated in the multicultural dynamics of the Canadian nation.
